# Log Cabin Quilt Workshop

Supplies:

- Machine (QC has at least 5 machines and other members may share)
- Thread,pins
- Seam ripper
- QC has rulers, cutting boards, rotary cutters and mats

Cutting:

- 1. 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch strips in dark colors and light colors with great contrast will be cut into pieces
- 2. Chart below shows the size of pieces that will be needed for each block that will be made for your project If you are making a 4 block quilt, cut 4 of each
- 3. Make piles that correlate to each piece and number them 1-12
















#### Figure #1

Using The pile of center squares and the pile of light pieces labeled #1 sew one of each, right sides together to make pairs one after the other until all are done, cut them apart, Open the seam, and finger press or iron the seam open

## Figure #2

Using the piece just made and a light piece(log) labeled #2, sew together as illustrated below and in the chart and in the large chart Chain sew together until all are done. Cut apart, finger press or iron open. This square should measure 4 ½ inches Trim as needed

The first light logs are complete



### Figure #3

Using the square that was just completed and the Piece (log)labeled # 3, sew together as illustrated below in the chain method, until all are completed. Cut and press open

### Figure #4

Add piece (log) # 4 as illustrated below in the chain method until all are completed cut and press open This block should measure 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches Trim as needed The first dark logs are complete



Continue with the rest of the logs in the same way following the layout on the main chart of the block.

The block should increase by 2 inches with every two logs sewn on. The final block will be 15 inches
